Recommendations

Acceptable letters of recommendation are from guidance counselors, college faculty, high school faculty and past and present employers.

Information Sharing

An information sharing session is part of the admissions process for all candidates. At that time, we will discuss the profession of dental hygiene, our program at the College of Dentistry, your qualifications for the program, transfer credits and answer all your specific questions. You will only be contacted for a session when your application is received with all official academic credentials, application fee, two letters of recommendation, and personal statement.

Writing Placement Exam

All accepted students must take a Writing Placement Exam through the School of Continuing and Professional Studies of New York University. **Pending the results of your mandatory writing placement exam, you may be required to take individual writing courses listed below before registering for Writing Workshop I.** Exam scores are usually forwarded to the Dental Hygiene Office after two weeks of the exam date. You may contact our office at that time to receive your results.

- Effective Reading and Writing for College (*non-credit course*)
- Grammar Strategies (*non-credit course*)
- Intensive Writing (*optional non-credit or 2 credit course*)
- Mastering Correct English (*non-credit course*)

This exam may be waived, **by review**, for students entering the program intending to transfer two-courses, with grade "B" or better, of College-level English Composition.

Transfer Students

Transfer of Writing Courses

Students entering the program may be reviewed for satisfying the writing requirement by transferring two-courses, at the time of admission, with grade "B" or better, of College level English Composition from an accredited College or University if they have previously completed **at least fifteen (15)** college credits with a cumulative GPA of 2.8 or better.

- Official transcript(s) must be submitted.
- Students may be asked to submit graded coursework and or course descriptions relating to the desired courses to be transferred.
- Two- courses must be transferred. One course will not be transferred.

Transfer Credits

The transferring of credits process is done after official college transcript(s) or translated course by course evaluated documents have been received (Students must be registered for credits to post on academic records). The courses are reviewed for similar content and level. Science courses are transferred at a grade of "B" or better. Liberal arts courses are transferred at a grade of "C" or better. All students who transfer courses must still meet the competency requirements found within the course in order for the transfer to be completed. **Official transcripts from all previously attended institutions must be submitted.**

NOTE TO STUDENTS WITH FOREIGN TRANSCRIPTS - The Dental Hygiene Program will only consider evaluations from ECE for transfer credits. Course transfers may be limited, subject to intense review of course content through the student providing course descriptions and may require the student to take a proficiency exam to consider core course(s) for transfer.

Once a student is matriculated and enrolled in the Dental Hygiene Program, core science or writing courses will not be transferred. Only Psychology, Sociology, Oral Communications and extra liberal arts credits can be transferred from another accredited institution as matriculated student. Only under limited circumstances may the Dean of Allied Health Programs grant permission to approve any other course(s).

NOTE: CREDITS ARE NOT TRANSFERRED FOR COURSES TAKEN MORE THAN TEN (10) YEARS.

The American Language Institute

The American Language Institute of the School of Continuing and Professional Studies of New York University offers intensive courses in English for students with little or no proficiency in the language. It also offers the University Preparatory Workshop program in English for students with English proficiency insufficient to undertake a full academic program but sufficient for a part-time academic program in combination with part-time English study. This combination may constitute a full-time program of study.

NOTE: Some students may be accepted into the Dental Hygiene Program contingent upon the results of testing through this institute or may be recommended to take intensive English courses through this department upon the results of the University's mandatory Writing Placement Exam (once accepted into the program).
