

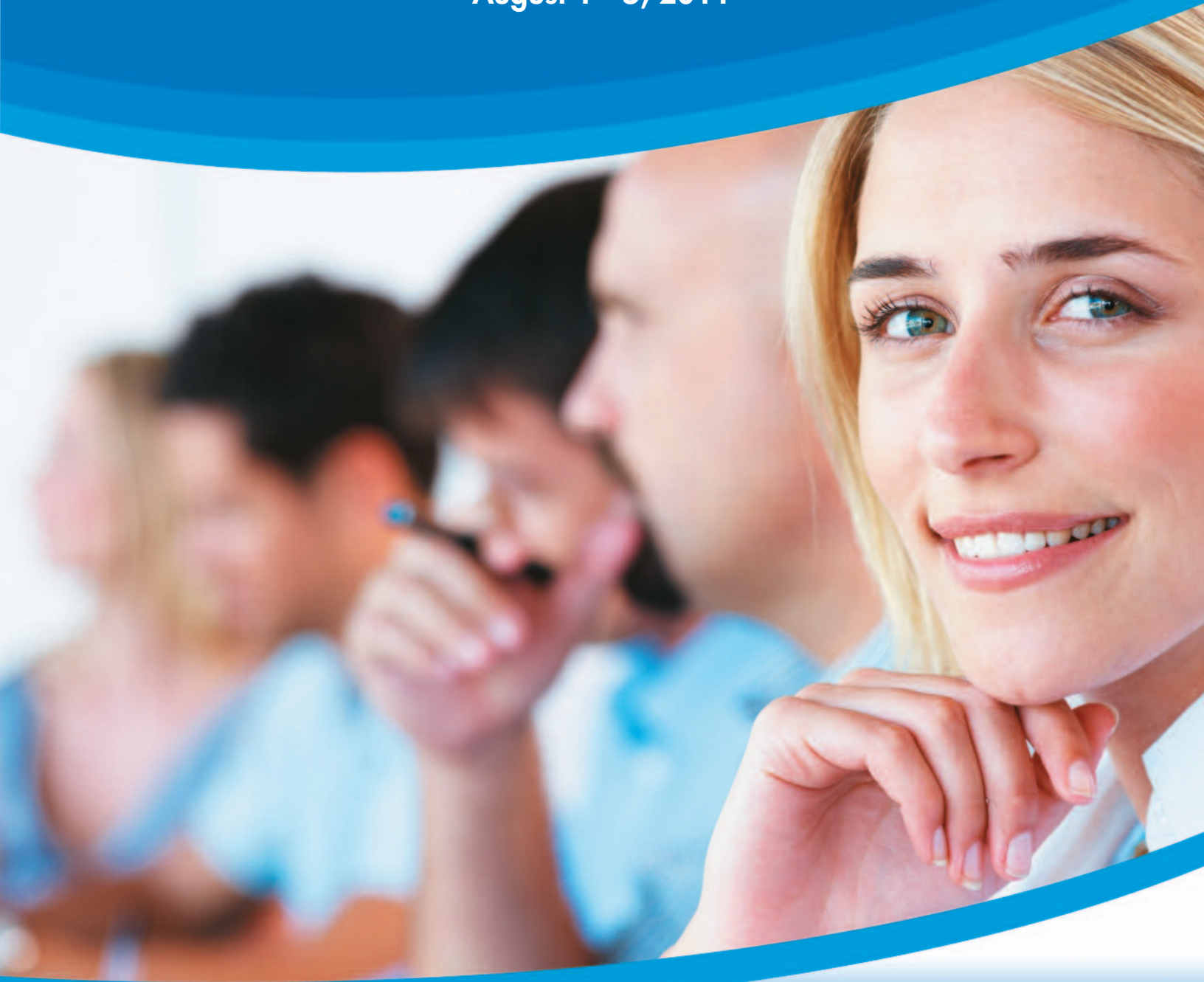

Aesthetic and implant procedures constitute the main drivers of a contemporary dental practice. However the achievement of dento-gingival aesthetics is a complex endeavor that may extend beyond the scope of ceramic artistry. Implant therapy is not without complications and the clinician must therefore become cognizant of situations exhibiting the potential for sub-optimal aesthetic outcomes, including scenarios where tooth preservation may be the preferred alternative. This evidence-based presentation will cover multiple aspects of implant aesthetics, including diagnostic considerations as well as advanced restorative and surgical techniques.

Secrets To Success Of High Strength Ceramics In Implant Dentistry

Due to high aesthetic demands of patients, dentists are driven to fabricate natural-looking restorations, not only for the anterior, but also for the posterior region. Due to their preferred optical and biological properties, all-ceramic materials are thought to be the ideal prosthetic component to fulfill the requirements of tooth and implant-supported restorations. Apart from the initial strength of a ceramic, the long-term success of a ceramic material is related to micro-structural resistance against aging. Understanding of the preferred clinical application for each ceramic system introduces new opportunities for reducing the failure rate.

Immediate And Delayed Loading Of Implants

Recently, immediate loading of dental implants has become very popular. Once considered an experimental method of treatment in the edentulous mandible, it is now applied to a broader range of clinical situations; from maxillary arches to partial edentulism and single tooth replacement. Nevertheless, due to the numerous variables present and the potential for excessive use of some methods beyond rational clinical indications, the achievement of clinical success is not always the final outcome. In order to avoid failure that sometimes can be catastrophic, it is important to properly evaluate all the factors involved in these treatment modalities.

He is an executive director of the Osseointegration Study Club of Japan and a board member of the Japanese Academy of Clinical Periodontology. Dr. Ishikawa is a founder of 5-D Japan and maintains a private practice in Hamamatsu, Shizuoka, Japan.



Akiyoshi Funato, DDS

Dr. Funato earned his dental degree from the Hiroshima University School of Dentistry. Dr. Stappert is Director of Aesthetics and Periodontal-Prosthodontics at the Department of Periodontology and Implant Dentistry associated with the Department of Biomaterials & Biomimetics at New York University College of Dentistry. He earned a D.D.S. and his doctorate from the Johannes-Gutenberg-University Mainz, Germany. Dr. Stappert is a board-certified Prosthodontist (DGZPW, Germany) and remains Associate Professor of the Department of Prosthodontics, Albert-Ludwigs-University Freiburg, Germany, where he received the 'venia legendi' (Priv.-Doz.). He is presently Director and Scientific Chair of the Aesthetic Symposium as well as Director of the Annual Implant Continuum at NYUCD.

Dr. del Castillo received his dental degree and his Certificate in Periodontics from Tufts University, School of Dental Medicine. He is an Adjunct Professor, Department of Periodontics at Tufts University, School of Dental Medicine and a guest lecturer at Maryland University Dental School.
