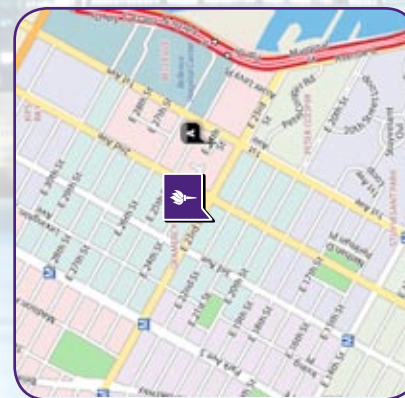

■ **MONDAY, AUGUST 4, 2008** / 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

TOPIC OF INTEREST: Esthetic and Gingival Problems of the Single Tooth Implant

DISCUSSION LEADER: Dr. Arnold Weisgold

This presentation will deal with the unique features that impact on the aesthetic and gingival management of the single tooth implant. In many respects the type of periodontium is as much a factor in success as the actual fixture position. Sulcular form, mesiodistal and facio-lingual location of the fixture, apical postining of the fixture, ridge morphology and emrasure considerations will be dealt with in detail. The actual position of the artificial crown relative to the adjacent natural teeth and edentulous ridge will be analyzed and the manner in which this managed will be reviewed. The difficulties involved with positioning implants adjacent to other implants, next to natural teeth and proximity to edentulous areas will be discussed in depth.



■ **TUESDAY, AUGUST 5, 2008** / 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

TOPIC OF INTEREST: Comprehensive Treatment Planning for Ultimate Aesthetics and Function with Implants

DISCUSSION LEADER: Dr. Dennis Tarnow

Dr. Tarnow will discuss the integration of advanced disciplines of dentistry to arrive at an optimal treatment solution for the complex patient. Surgical, restorative, orthodontic, endodontic, periodontal, and wound healing knowledge and principles are required to create the finest, longest lasting, most aesthetic restorations possible. The evaluation of therapeutic alternatives followed by the proper sequence of therapy will be the focus of this discussion. Case presentations and video taped procedures will be used in the discussion.

Dr. Tarnow will also open the discussion to the participants allowing for a forum on their most relevant and pressing issues. The emphasis will be on practical recommendations that the group can take home and use immediately.



■ **WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 6, 2008** / 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

TOPIC OF INTEREST: Advances and Innovations in Sinus Lift Procedures - "Live Surgery"

DISCUSSION LEADER: Dr. Stephen Wallace

Dr. Wallace's session is focused on the optimal treatment planning of the posterior maxilla. He will review the literature of this topic to arrive at an evidence-based decision making strategy for maximizing success even in the most difficult of cases involving limited bone and extremely demanding patients. Clinical guidelines will be presented that lead to successful outcomes with minimal complications. Various technological advancements will be reviewed to facilitate sinus lift surgery and to allow for more predictable results in accelerated treatment plans. A live case demonstration will be performed to highlight these techniques and technologies.



■ **THURSDAY, AUGUST 7, 2008** / 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

TOPIC OF INTEREST: Advanced Bone Grafting Techniques for Dental Implants

DISCUSSION LEADER: Dr. Craig Misch

Dr. Misch's session will address immediate restoration and function by focusing on the criteria for patient evaluation and case selection. Topics discussed will include clinical guidelines for implant surgery, temporary prosthesis fabrication and delivery, and maintenance to ensure long-term results. Dr. Misch will also discuss the ability to enhance bone volume and contour for implant placement along with techniques for alveolar reconstructions that follow prosthetic parameters to fulfill ideal aesthetic, biomechanical and functional requirements.



■ **FRIDAY, AUGUST 8, 2008** / 9:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.

TOPIC OF INTEREST: Immediate Loading and Lasers in Surgical Dentistry

DISCUSSION LEADER: Dr. George Romanos

Immediate Loading in Lasers in Surgical Dentistry has been accepted as an evidence based concept in the anterior part of the mandible. The presentation will focus on the immediate functional concept of implants placed in poor bone qualities and compromised bone metabolism. The main characteristics of the implant design, implant / abutment connection as well as the requirements for a successful treatment will be demonstrated.

The second part of this presentation will be focused on the laser treatment in implant dentistry. The clinician will be able to learn more about the different laser wave lengths, the laser-tissue interactions as well as their applications in Implant dentistry. The presentation will illustrate a high number of periimplantitis cases as well as the long-term clinical outcome after the use of implant surface decontamination using lasers.
