14th Street Y offers a variety of day camp programs, including mini camps for children as young as 17 months, a day camp emphasizing Japanese language and culture for children 3-7 years, a city-based camp for children 3 ½ to 6 years and a country day camp for children 5-11 years.

British International School introduces its new summer camp during 2008 with full day or half day scheduling options for children ages 3-7. Children participate in sports, arts and crafts, science, music, drama, outdoor games, and free play time.

Camp Intrepid is an inter-disciplinary full-day camp for 6-13 year olds. The camp has a weekly theme which is supplemented by the hands-on activities and explorations at the museum.

Campus Kids holds weekday sleep away camps in New York, New Jersey, and Connecticut. Children ages 7-15 spend the week at camp doing crafts, music, sports, and other traditional camp activities, then return home for the weekends.

Children's Aid Society - Philip Coltoff Center offers a day camp for children ages 3 to 7 years at their Sullivan Street location. Children beginning at 8 years can attend the William Osborn Day Camp, Children's Aid Society's country day camp based in Staten Island. Bus transportation and pickup is available from Sullivan Street.

Claremont Prep camp program is designed for students Pre-k through 4th grade. Swimming lessons in the school pool will be an integral part of the summer experience.

Downtown Day Camp offers a wide variety of activities for grade school children. Camp will take place at the new Downtown Community Center.

Friends Seminary offers day camps for children starting at age 3 and continuing through 8th grade. Older campers engage in creative projects, participate in service learning projects, and learn about sports, arts and crafts, cooking, and more. Younger campers split their day between creative activities and outdoor/sports activities.

Little Red School House and Elizabeth Irwin High School (LREI) offers a variety of day camps for all children ages 3.5 to 14 years. Children are grouped by age and can select from a range of choice classes.

McBurney YMCA offers traditional day camp as well as sports camps (soccer, swimming, volleyball, basketball, martial arts) and specialty camps with topics like cooking, dance, film making and science. Children ages 12-15 can participate in the Y Travelers camp where they participate in activities at a new site each day. Financial assistance is available.

Oasis offers general recreational day camps in three New York City boroughs (Manhattan, Brooklyn, and Queens), Westchester, Long Island, and New Jersey for children ages 4-11. Oasis also has summer travel and leadership programs for children ages 12-15 years.

Parks Summer Camps are offered at a few recreation centers in various parks in Manhattan. Programs are traditional in their arrangement and are offered at the Alfred E. Smith, Hansborough and Tony Dapolito recreation centers. Programs are offered in the other boroughs as well.
