## Application Deadlines

You may begin your studies in the fall semester or spring semester or the summer term. The application deadlines are listed below.\*

### Fall Semester Deadlines

The Gallatin School has three application deadlines for the fall.

**February 1** Fall Priority Deadline (*Applications received by this date will be given priority for financial aid and housing consideration.*)

**February 1** Fall International Student Deadline

**March 1** Fall Deadline

**Spring Semester Deadline** November 1

**Summer Term Deadline** February 1

\* Applications may be submitted before the deadlines. Applications received after the final deadline may be considered at the discretion of the Admissions Committee.

## Housing

If you wish to be considered for graduate on-campus housing, please check “Yes” in item number 4B of the Application for Admission. On-campus housing is available for full-time students only.

## Admission Testing

The Gallatin School does not require standardized testing such as the GRE or GMAT. However, if you have taken such an examination and wish to submit your scores, you are encouraged to do so.

## International Students

All students with foreign credentials must submit official documents in the original language, including proof of conferral of degree/diploma. If the documents are in a language other than English, you must also submit a certified English translation. Official documents or certified photocopies are characterized by an original signature of the registrar or other designated school official or an original impression of the institution’s seal. International students are not eligible for federal or state financial aid.

It is essential for all students to be able to understand and communicate in English, both written and oral. To measure this ability, every applicant whose native language is not English is required to take the TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language). Information concerning this examination may be obtained by writing directly to TOEFL/TSE, P.O. Box 6151, Princeton, NJ 08541, U.S.A., or by visiting their Web site at [www.toefl.org](http://www.toefl.org). The institution code for the Gallatin School of Individualized Study is 2569. To expedite processing, the Gallatin School encourages students to send their own copies of TOEFL results with the application material. However, the official test score report from TOEFL is still required. Each student must request that his or her scores on this examination be sent to the Office of Graduate Admissions, Gallatin School.

Because English proficiency is essential to a student’s success in the Gallatin School, additional testing may be administered when a student arrives at New York University. Occasionally, Gallatin requires a student to register for noncredit English courses that will entail additional expense and extend the time normally required to complete the student’s degree.

To be considered for any type of financial assistance, you must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). NYU recommends that you submit the FAFSA electronically from FAFSA on the Web at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov). The University's institution code is 002785.

**Deadline:** It is recommended that you submit the FAFSA by March 1 for fall and summer admission. However, applications for financial aid will continue to be reviewed as funds remain available. Please review the Application Deadlines box on the previous page for the admission application deadlines for financial aid applicants.

## Full-Time and Part-Time Students

### GRADUATE GALLATIN SCHOLARSHIP

A Gallatin scholarship may be awarded to eligible students and is based on financial need and merit. **To apply:** Check "Yes" in item number 4C of the Application for Admission. You must also submit the FAFSA.

### GALLATIN DEAN'S SCHOLARSHIP

The Gallatin Dean's Scholarships are small tuition awards that may be given to enrolled Gallatin students who have a 3.0 GPA or better, have no incomplete grades, and have filed a current FAFSA that shows need. **To apply:** Admitted students must complete an application for the Gallatin Dean's Scholarship. Applications are available at the main Gallatin reception desk on the first day of registration for awards in the following semester.

### LOANS

Student loans are administered through the Office of Financial Aid. **To apply:** Submit the FAFSA.

### THE FEDERAL WORK-STUDY PROGRAM

The Federal Work-Study Program, for students enrolled for at least 6 credits, combines federal and University resources to fund a limited number of part-time jobs, usually in campus offices and organizations. You are considered for Federal Work-Study when you apply for financial aid.

### THE STUDENT EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM

A list is maintained of current jobs available on and off campus for students who need to cover their graduate study expenses through employment. Students must be enrolled for a minimum

of 6 credits to apply for student employment. **To apply:** Contact the Wasserman Center for Career Development, 133 East 13th Street, 2nd Floor, 212-998-4730, or visit [www.nyu.edu/careerdevelopment](http://www.nyu.edu/careerdevelopment).

### NEW YORK UNIVERSITY PAYMENT PLANS

The Deferred Payment Plan is an installment agreement between the student and New York University that allows students to extend tuition payments over a semester. This plan is available to full- or part-time students who are matriculated and registered for at least 6 credits and who do not have a previously unsatisfactory University credit record. Students pay 50 percent of the net amount due for the current term at registration and the remainder plus interest in two installments. **To apply:** Contact the Office of the Bursar, New York University, 25 West Fourth Street, New York, NY 10012-1119, 212-998-2800, or visit [www.nyu.edu/bursar](http://www.nyu.edu/bursar).

TuitionPay Plan, formerly administered by Academic Management Services (AMS), allows tuition and on-campus housing payments to be paid in monthly installments. It is not a loan program; thus, there are no interest payments or finance charges. There is an application fee. **To apply:** Contact TuitionPay directly at 800-635-0120 for application and deadline information or visit their Web site.

## Full-Time Students

### THE NYU REYNOLDS FELLOWSHIP IN SOCIAL ENTREPRENEURSHIP

The Reynolds Program in Social Entrepreneurship offers 20 graduate fellowships each year to students across the University. The program is a comprehensive initiative designed to equip the next generation of social entrepreneurial leaders and infrastructure developers and managers with the skills, resources, and networking opportunities needed to help solve society's most intractable problems in sustainable and scalable ways. The graduate fellowship provides up to \$50,000 over two years and dedicated curricular and cocurricular activities. **To apply:** Check "Yes" in item number 4D of the Application for Admission. ### FOREIGN LANGUAGE AND AREA STUDIES (FLAS) FELLOWSHIPS

Foreign Language and Area Studies (FLAS) fellowships provide tuition, fees, and a stipend to full-time graduate students who are studying a modern foreign language as part of their academic program on Europe, Latin America, the Caribbean, or the Middle East in preparation for a career that will utilize their language studies. The fellowships are administered for the U.S. Department of Education by the three designated National Resource Centers at New York University. The centers and the eligible languages of award are as follows:

Applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents and must enroll in one language course and area studies courses each semester. Students in all disciplines are eligible to apply; summer FLAS awards are also available for intensive language study in the U.S. and abroad.

### RESIDENTIAL EDUCATION ASSISTANTSHIP OPPORTUNITIES: RESIDENT ASSISTANTS (RAs) AND COMMUNITY EDUCATION ASSISTANTS (CEAs)

RAs and CEAs are full-time students who live in the residence halls and are responsible for organizing, implementing, and evaluating social, educational, and community development activities. They also serve as key sources of campus and neighborhood information for hall residents. Remuneration for RAs consists of room and board. CEAs assume additional administrative and limited supervisory responsibilities; therefore, in addition to room and board, they receive a stipend.

### NYU AMERICA READS/AMERICA COUNTS

America Reads/America Counts is the largest program of its kind in the nation and provides an excellent opportunity for graduate students to earn money while working in a rewarding job. Working under the supervision of classroom teachers, NYU students help schoolchildren acquire literacy and/or mathematical skills. Tutors need not be enrolled in a preparation program or have prior tutoring experience, but must be able to make a minimum weekly commitment of six hours in blocks of no less than two hours. Tutors must have a Federal Work-Study allotment determined on the basis of the FAFSA in order to participate in the program. **For more information:** Visit [www.steinhardt.nyu.edu/americanreads](http://www.steinhardt.nyu.edu/americanreads).

### NEW YORK STATE TUITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (TAP)

The TAP grant is available to full-time New York State residents who demonstrate financial need. **To apply:** Complete all sections of the FAFSA and be sure to complete the State Section indicating that you are a state resident. ## Part-Time Students

To accommodate those who are part-time students, the Gallatin School offers a number of scholarships to students registered for fewer than 12 credits. To be eligible for part-time financial aid, students must be enrolled for a minimum of 6 credits. **To apply:** Complete the FAFSA and check “Yes” in item 4C of the Application for Admission.

## International Students

International students are generally not eligible for federal or state financial aid. However, several private loan options are available for international students. CitiAssist Global is a private loan program for international students from all countries.
