

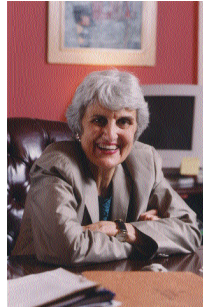

Congratulations, Graduates!

On May 11, the Graduate School will hold its annual convocation and confer master's and doctoral degrees on our students.

In the audience and on stage will be mentors, advisers, families, partners, and friends. We will be in Avery Fisher Hall in Lincoln Center in mid-town Manhattan. Avery Fisher is a concert hall, usually home to orchestras and singers and chamber music groups. We will be creating a music of our own.

Each and every degree represents a great achievement. Whether they are in Anthropology or English or Mathematics, no matter what the field, earning them takes a major investment of time, energy, brains, will and money. Moments of exhilaration are balanced against moments of anxiety. Moments of total devotion to learning are balanced against moments of fear about what to do next with the degree. Not everyone who begins graduate study can finish it. As a result, our congratulations to our graduates - and to the people who have supported them - are genuine and deeply felt.

Like a degree in law or medicine, a graduate degree in arts and science has heft, substance, and meaning. It signifies unusual intellectual competence, the honed ability to ask new questions and seeks new answers to old ones, the capacity to learn and to teach, and finally, the ability to sift through information and to garner knowledge and, I hope, wisdom. If the medical doctor specializes in health and healing, and the lawyer in a legal system and justice, we in arts and science specialize in learning, in knowing, in

speaking to others about what we know, and in thinking things through. I believe that this specialization has never been of greater general importance, given the fact that we live in a world that can be at once so superficial and so overloaded with often trivial data, and, at the same time, a world that is so riddled with dangerous polemic and so prone to being spun like icky cotton candy.



Because of our specialization, I believe that we have special responsibilities in and to the world. I have often written in these Dean's Messages about the ethics of inquiry: absolute integrity and honesty, a commitment to intellectual complexity, a respect for others and other voices, a devotion to freedom of inquiry. We must act on these ethics. As we do so, we must realize that seeking knowledge is an intricate balancing act between the necessary imperatives of research (go as far as your mind will take you) and the ethical questions of research (how can my learning and teaching be of service?)

On May 11, we will remember the seriousness and significance of the degrees that the University is awarding and that our graduates have earned, but we will also take zestful pleasure in the accomplishment that these degrees represent. This occasion is really worth celebrating with joyful musics.

GSAS CONVOCATION HIGHLIGHTS

On May 11th, three doctoral students will have the opportunity to share personal moments at the GSAS Convocation at Avery Fisher Hall, Lincoln Center. Each will be hooded by a family member.

Jasmine Mir, Department of History, recipient of a Mellon Foundation Fellowship, the 2002-2003 NYU CSGS Joan Heller Dissertation Award in Gender & Sexuality, and founding membership in the Graduate Forum, will be hooded by her brother, Adnan Husain, who is currently a professor in the NYU Departments of Middle Eastern and Islamic Studies and History. Adnan received his Ph.D. in History from the University of California at Berkeley in 1998 and later that same year joined the NYU faculty. Jasmine's dissertation, "Marketplace of Desire," explores turn of the twentieth century New Orleans and its infamous vice district, Storyville.

Adnan's work focuses on the intellectual, cultural and religious interactions between Muslims, Christians and Jews in the Medieval Mediterranean world.

Karen Albright, Department of Sociology, a recipient of the the 2003-

2004 Dean's Outstanding Graduate Student Teaching Award in the Social Sciences (which she also won in 2000-2001), will be hooded by her grandfather, 90-year old Arnold DeWald Albright, who received his Ph.D. from the NYU School of Education in 1951. Her dissertation examines the dynamics of subjective class identification in women of different racial and socioeconomic backgrounds. In August, Karen will begin a postdoctoral fellowship at the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Scholars in Health Policy Research Program at the University of California at Berkeley.

Arnold DeWald Albright's career was in higher education and administration and served for many decades as president of various colleges and universities, including Northern Kentucky University and Morehead State University. He also served as Acting President of the University of Kentucky.

Aaron Kupchik, Department of Sociology, served as a Graduate Student Teaching Fellow (formerly Master Teaching Assistant) for three years and recipient of the 1999-2000 the Dean's Outstanding Graduate Student Teaching Award in the Social Sciences, will be hooded by his father, Herbert Kupchik, who earned his Ph.D. in Biochemistry

from Wayne State University in 1967. Aaron has completed his first year as an Assistant Professor in Justice Studies at Arizona State University and his work focuses on the social construction of adolescence and the social control of youth.

Much of Herbert's research dealt with the development and use of methods to diagnose gastrointestinal cancers. He recently retired as Professor of Microbiology and of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine at Boston University School of Medicine.

Horizon Fellowship Opens With New Ways of Considering Space



Jan-Willem Rombouts

Jan-Willem Rombouts, a fourth-year doctoral candidate from the Department of Physics is the first recipient of the **Horizon Fellowship in the Natural and Physical Sciences**. This award supports research and study abroad, or travel abroad to present invited papers, and is available for doctoral students in Biology, Chemistry, and Physics.

Jan-Willem and his advisor, Professor M. Porrati, have worked on theoretical models which predict a modification of Einstein's gravity at very large distance scales.

In recent years it was observed that our universe is expanding faster and faster. It was known since the early 20th century that the universe was expanding, but only some years ago did physicists discover that the rate of expansion is actually increasing. One approach to explaining the acceleration of the universe is that these observations are not caused by dark energy, but by the fact that (the laws of) gravity itself changes at ultra-large distances. A very promising model in that spirit was proposed by Professors G. Dvali, G. Gabadadze and M. Porrati (named the DGP model). It assumed that our 4-dimensional world is actually embedded in a 5-dimensional space, somewhat like an immense sheet floating in a higher dimensional world, on which our matter is localized.

Jan-Willem and his advisor developed a slight variation of this model, which has an easy generalization to more than 5 dimensions. They have also been interested in how DGP and other infrared modifications of Einstein's gravity work as a quantum theory. His dissertation "Topics in UV/IR Modifications of Gravity" (expected graduation in Spring 2005) will cumulate his research and will further him into a postdoctoral position.

In addition to the strength of his research skills, Jan-Willem has also demonstrated excellence in teaching, having won the 2002-2003 Dean's Outstanding Teaching Award and the 2003 American Association of Physics Teachers' Outstanding Graduate Teacher Award. He admits that while it is not easy to combine research and teaching responsibilities, he enjoys introducing counterintuitive concepts in Relativity and Quantum Mechanics to undergraduates. He adds, "It's good to be challenged by students as a scientist, even on the basic laws of Physics" because teaching helps him to always strive to be a better scientist.
