# New York University and the Moses Center

New York University has developed a national reputation for providing quality services and accessibility to academically qualified Deaf and hard of hearing students. NYU's Deaf and hard of hearing students have studied in virtually all of our 14 schools and colleges, on both graduate and undergraduate levels.

The Henry and Lucy Moses Center for Students with Disabilities exists to facilitate equal access to the programs and activities of New York University for Deaf and hard of hearing students. Our goal is for each student to acquire the skills and personal growth necessary to develop an independent lifestyle, which we believe to be essential in meeting individual career and life objectives.

## Services

---

The Moses Center works individually with each student in assessment for appropriate accommodations. The following services are offered by the center.

### Interpreters/CART/C-Print Services

---

NYU employs full-time as well as freelance interpreters. All NYU interpreters are highly skilled professionals, who hold certification from the National Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf. NYU also provides CART (computer-aided real-time translation) and C-Print services to qualified students.

Students may request interpreter/CART/C-Print services for classroom lectures, fieldwork, meeting with faculty members and administration, and for any program or activity sponsored by NYU.

### Notetakers

---

Students are funded to pay notetakers for each course in which they enroll. Notetakers are selected from among others enrolled in the class.

### Programs, Workshops, and Personal Support

---

Newly admitted Deaf and hard of hearing students attend an orientation program sponsored by the Moses Center, which is designed to clarify important policies and

procedures. The orientation program also provides students with the opportunity to learn about the academic and recreational resources of NYU and an occasion to meet other Deaf and hard of hearing students in the community.

The program coordinators for Deaf and hard of hearing students offer ongoing support to students on an "as needed" basis.

### Financial Aid

---

The Moses Center administers retention scholarship funds specifically for students with disabilities. These private scholarships are designed to supplement state and federal aid programs and are need-based. Funds are designated for matriculated, continuing students.

### Housing

---

An emergency signal system for fire and doorbell will be installed on request.

### Auxiliary Aids

---

NYU has several portable FM systems that can be requested for use in classrooms/lectures. In addition, pay telephones equipped with amplification and TTYs can be found at several sites on campus. Television decoders are available for classroom videotape presentations.
