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The Moses Center

The Henry and Lucy Moses Center for Students with Disabilities (CSD) provides comprehensive services and programs for undergraduate and graduate students with visual, hearing, orthopedic, and psychological impairments, as well as chronic illnesses and learning disabilities/attention deficit disorders. Through the years, CSD has expanded and diversified to incorporate new technologies and approaches. The growth of the center and the high level of sophistication needed to provide reasonable accommodations are balanced with a humanistic approach that enhances independence and recognizes the uniqueness of each individual.

Mission and Goals

CSD was established to facilitate equal access to the programs and activities of New York University for students with disabilities. Our goal is for each student to acquire the skills and personal growth necessary to develop an independent lifestyle, which we believe to be essential in meeting individual career and life objectives.

Service Areas

CSD is staffed by a number of specialists, each of whom has expertise in a specific disability area. Services for students are divided into the following areas:

- Students who have learning disabilities and/or attention deficit disorders
- Students who are blind and visually impaired
- Students who are Deaf and hard of hearing
- Students who have mobility and orthopedic impairments
- Students with chronic illnesses or psychological impairments

Accommodations

Each student who registers with CSD works with a staff specialist to develop an individual accommodation plan. This plan is devised to determine specific services the student will require as well as any additional adaptations that need to be made.

General Services

- Testing accommodations
- Adaptive computer equipment
- Provision of sign language interpreters
- Specialized library assistance
- Retention scholarships
- Provision of funding for the following:
 - Readers
 - Notetakers
 - Research aides
 - Mobility orientation (for visually impaired)

The center will arrange for any accommodations that are reasonable and do not compromise academic standards. As a service that is a part of the NYU central administration, the center maintains strong liaisons with the offices of admissions, financial aid, registration, the bursar, and housing and with the dean's office of each school or college. Should any access issues arise, the center will assist in providing the support and resources needed to resolve the problem.

Student Life

New York University is located in the heart of Greenwich Village, one of the most culturally diverse neighborhoods in the United States. Through cooperative efforts between University and local officials, the area around Washington Square is one of the most wheelchair accessible in New York City. Shops, clubs, boutiques, restaurants, and theatres abound.
