ACTIVITIES FOR STUDENTS WITH SIBLINGS (9:30am to 12:15pm)

While parents attend the academic programs, NYU students with siblings are encouraged to explore the city on their own or visit the Sibling Lounge located on the eighth floor of the Kimmel Center. Students
