## 2009 Fall Housing Check-In information

**Check-in begins on Sunday August 30, 2009 at 9:00 am  
(earlier check-in is not possible)**

To expedite the check-in process students whose last names begin with:

- A-M should check-in from 9am-1pm
- N-Z should check-in from 1pm-5pm

On the day you plan to check in, check the weather report, dress comfortably, and stay relaxed: you will be standing in lines to check-in and waiting for elevators.

Limited moving carts will be available, however if you have your own hand truck or luggage carrier you may wish to bring them. You may also opt to have seasonal items shipped to arrive any time after check-in.

Remember: This will be a long day. Moving in your belongings can be hard work, but you will get moved in and settled.

### **PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS**

Parking in New York City can be a challenge. Most of the prime spots on the street get filled-up quickly and you need to know about special New York City parking rules like "alternate side of the street parking days."

In order to facilitate your move, we offer the following information and suggestions:

- We have notified the local police and asked for their cooperation regarding traffic conditions.
- Please do not leave your vehicle double parked and unattended.
- When you reach the front of the building, please unload your vehicle and remove it from the area expeditiously in order to allow others to unload.
- There is parking in the surrounding streets where **SUNDAY** regulations are in effect.
- Should you elect to park in a public facility, please refer to the attached listing of parking lots nearest NYU dormitories. For your convenience we have included each parking lots address, telephone number and Police Precinct.

There are more than 2,300 parking facilities in the City. While they are licensed by the City's Department of Consumer Affairs, their prices are not regulated. Overnight parking typically costs \$20 - \$28 a day. All parking garages and lots in Manhattan charge a 10.25% tax and an 8% surcharge. Many of them will also surcharge oversized and luxury vehicles.
