Historical Notes: Built as a stable, probably in the 1830s or 1940s, most likely for a tenant of 6 Washington Square North, which shares the same lot. It was later converted for residential use. Acquired by NYU in 1949.
Landmark Status: Greenwich Village Historic District
Building Type: R2
Number of Stories: 2
Street Facade: Washington Mews (north)

Original & Historic Features

General

- Red pressed-brick facade original (75%).
- Original chimney visible on rooftop.
- Original brownstone sill and lintels on 2nd story (50%).
- Historic alterations include bluestone sills and lintel on 2nd story, and reconfiguration of ground floor masonry openings. Existing windows may have been two large stable doors. Existing doorway is part of this historic alteration. Historic red brick infill closely matches original brick. Sills are yellowish-gray sandstone.

Note: There is no historic photograph for this building since it shared the same tax lot as 6 WSN.

Non-Historic Alterations

General

- 6/6 wood replacement windows (100%).
- Wood door and transom are appropriate replacements.
- Cornice consists of copper gutter.
- Sheet metal door-lintel panning is not historic.
- Small lantern-style light fixture attached to brick adjacent to door.
- Non-historic signage: carved into wood below transom and metal numbers on door.
- Brick was abrasively cleaned.
- Brick next to door was patched with non-matching mix.
