Historical Notes: One in a row of ten 2-story houses built on former gardens for 7-13 Washington Square North when the row was developed in 1939. Acquired by NYU in 1949.
Landmark Status: Greenwich Village Historic District
Building Type: R2
Number of Stories: 2
Street Facades: Washington Mews (north) and entrance courtyard for 7-13 Washington Square North (south)

Original & Historic Features

General

- North elevation covered with stucco (original); south elevation made of white-glazed brick and red brick sills.
- 6/6 wood windows, 3/3 metal hoppers at south basement are original (50%).
- Glass-block infill at north and south facades is original.

Note: There is no historic photograph for this building since it shared the same tax lot as 7-13 Washington Square North.

Non-Historic Alterations

General

- Air-conditioning units installed into masonry below windows on south facade.
- Patched stucco at parapet, north facade, does not match original stucco; parapet may have been rebuilt.
- Bulkhead visible on roof.

Ground Floor

- French doors at 1st story of south facade are not original; surrounding masonry patched. Iron railing at doors is not original.
- Western windows at ground floor and basement on north facade were originally a doorway.
- Aluminum replacement windows at basement, north facade.
- Metal bars on windows are non-historic.
- Door is appropriate replacement.
- Stucco patched above basement windows, does not match original.
- Small lantern-style light fixture attached to stucco above door.
- Metal numbers on door are non-historic.
