Amita has also served as: a consultant to the Liberty Hill Foundation, Social Justice Philanthropy Collaborative, National Asian Pacific American Women's Forum, and Bard High School Early College; an Education Pioneers Fellow at The Broad Foundation and a Media Fellow at the Gay & Lesbian Alliance Against Defamation (GLAAD); a Faculty Member at Sadie Nash Leadership Project; and the Board Chair of the National Youth Advocacy Coalition.

She is the co-host of Flip the Script, a weekly radio show on KPFK Los Angeles, and enjoys writing and performing poetry in her spare time.

Amita holds a B.S. in Foreign Service from Georgetown University and an M.P.A. from the NYU Wagner School, where she was a Catherine B. Reynolds Fellow in Social Entrepreneurship.
