

Fees & Registration: Clinical Supervision

The cost of the Post-Master's Certificate is \$1 600 which can be paid in full at the start of the program or broken down into two equal payments of \$800. The Advanced Certificate (Group) is an additional \$800 (requires completion of the Post-Master's Certificate Program). *The fee includes the compendium of readings and access to NYU Bobst Library.*

Payment for the first half must be received by 8/03/09 The second payment is due 11/02/09. Withdrawal from the program after August 15 will result in a tuition refund less \$75 cancellation fee.

- 25% discount for NYU SSSW alumni and current field instructors (\$1200 for Certificate; an additional \$600 for Advanced Certificate (Group))
- 15% discount for NYU SSSW Post Master's Certificate Program alumni (\$1360 for Certificate; an additional \$680 for Advanced Certificate (Group))

Post-Master's and Advanced Certificates in Clinical Supervision

Who Should Attend

Supervisors, with an advanced degree in social work, psychology, psychiatric nursing, or rehabilitation counseling who have been in the field for three years are eligible for the clinical supervision certificate program. It is acceptable to be supervising either a student or a practitioner in order to participate.

Program

The certificate program provides a theoretical and practical understanding of the clinical supervision process based on case presentations and relevant readings. The program integrates theory with supervisory practice skills. The courses will assist supervisors to develop and expand their theoretical knowledge and teaching methods utilizing a psychodynamic framework. Completion of this certificate program meets the Specialized Training component to become a Certified Clinical Supervisor under the auspices of NBCC. For details visit: www.cce-global.org

Certificate Requirements

- The Certificate in Clinical Supervision is obtained in two semesters of study including Contemporary Issues in Clinical Supervision and the Advanced Case Seminar.
- Candidates for the Advanced Certificate in Clinical Supervision must take the additional course, Group Supervision. (Spring 2010 only)
- You may take the Certificate Courses and the Group Course simultaneously or sequentially.
- The Group course can be taken alone for a letter of completion.

Structure

Each class is limited to 15 students and consists of 10 two-hour sessions.

Contemporary Issues in Clinical Supervision (Fall 2009)

Advanced Practice Seminar (Spring 2010)

Mondays, bi-weekly, 6:00 - 8:00 pm, Sept 2009 - June 2010. Readings are assigned.

Group Supervision (Spring 2010)

Mondays, bi-weekly, 6:00 - 8:00 pm, Jan 2010 - June 2010. Readings are assigned.

Objectives

- Increase understanding of the psychodynamic theories upon which clinical supervision is based
- Educate students in the dynamics of the supervisory process, methods of providing clinical supervision, and approaches to addressing and resolving conflicts
- Enhance skills in providing clinical supervision through a case study model

Post-Master's Certificate in Clinical Supervision Faculty: Alice Wolson

Fall Course: Contemporary Issues in Clinical Supervision: Didactic and Experiential Format. Ten sessions focused on supervision theory and practice including:

Spring Course: Advanced Practice Seminar

This course uses material from supervisory relationships to demonstrate the application of supervisory theory and practice. Participants are required to present portions of supervisory experiences for in-depth analysis.

Advanced Certificate (Group Supervision)

Spring Course: Group Supervision

This course provides learning about group supervision practice and process. Participants learn through didactic and experiential approaches and models of group supervision.

**Requirement: completion of certificate or equivalent professional experience.*

**Participants establish an experiential group and rotate presentations based on agency-based groups.*
