During the twentieth century, a group of celebrated artists rediscovered the largely unexplored art form of lithography thanks to the Atelier Mourlot, a Parisian printshop founded in 1852 by the Mourlot family. The Atelier Mourlot originally specialized in the printing of wallpaper, but was transformed when the founder's grandson, Fernand Mourlot, invited a number of 20th-century artists to explore the complexities of fine art printing. Fernand encouraged the painters to work directly on lithographic stones in order to create original artworks that could then be executed under the direction of master printers in small editions. The combination of modern artist and master printer gave rise to unique and visually striking lithographs, which were beautifully used as posters to promote the artists' work. The exhibit is presented in partnership with the prestigious Galerie Mourlot New York, which was founded in 2006 by Fernand Mourlot's grandson, Eric Mourlot.

Formed in 1994 during their studies at the Juilliard School in New York, the Zappa.Mainolfi duo had its debut as part of the Chamber Music Series in Lincoln Center's Alice Tully Hall in 1994. The Zappa.Mainolfi Duo has recently performed extensively throughout Europe, such as in England, Germany, Netherlands, Belgium, Denmark, Sweden, Norway, France, Switzerland, and Italy. Additionally, they have been featured at several international music festivals and recorded for Swiss National Radio, Rai 3, Deutschland Radio and for the Italian labels "Ducale" and "Lyra Classica". In May 2008 the Duo recorded a CD of the complete Sonatas by B.Martinu released by the swiss label "Claves Records".

Held on the 20th anniversary of the fall of Communism in Eastern Europe, Rebel Waltz: Underground Music From Behind the Iron Curtain is a weekend-long music festival featuring Eastern European bands active in the underground music scene behind the Iron Curtain. Forced to play in illegal venues before 1989 and unable to travel, these bands faced oppression and censorship to make their voices heard. A weekend-long festival featuring Psi Vojaci (Czech Republic), Pankrti (Slovenia) Timpuri Noi (Romania) playing on November 6th from 7 pm, and Kontroll Csoport (Hungary), Dezerter (Poland) and Bez Ladu a Skladu (Slovak Republic) playing on November 7th from 11 pm.
