

NYU in Shanghai

NYU in Shanghai offers a rigorous academic curriculum with courses taught in both English and Chinese. Students majoring in art, business, history, media, and East Asian studies may enroll in advanced courses that fulfill many of their degree requirements. Day trips and guided excursions in and around Shanghai are included in the program. Volunteer opportunities and internships are also available.

Specialized Programs

- **Business:** NYU's world-renowned Leonard N. Stern School of Business offers courses in finance, management and organization, marketing, and operations management.
- **Chinese Language:** Six levels of Mandarin courses are available, with opportunities for students with superior language skills to take Chinese-taught subject courses at ECNU.
- **East Asian Studies:** Interdisciplinary courses examine the culture and history of China, and its place in today's global community.
- **Media Studies:** Courses in journalism, communication, media theory, advertising, and creative writing help students explore China's public culture through image and word.
- **Studio Art:** Students enroll in courses that explore Chinese art through various creative mediums, such as photography and painting.

NYU in Shanghai Facilities

Two convenient locations—one on the ECNU campus and the other downtown near Zhongshan Park. Facilities include classrooms, a computer lab, and meeting rooms.

Housing

Students choose from on-campus residences at ECNU or off-campus furnished apartments in the Zhongshan Park neighborhood near the center of downtown Shanghai.

How to Apply

Students apply online at www.nyu.edu/studyabroad/application. Application deadlines are posted online. The NYU Office of Global Programs reviews completed applications in multiple phases. Students are advised to apply by the earliest deadline.

Program costs

Approximate costs are \$23,000 per semester. Costs include tuition for full-time study, housing, excursions, and emergency/travel assistance coverage.

Academics

Our study abroad programs are crafted to include the quality of academic rigor and independent experience expected from NYU. Students can select from a full array of disciplines taught by NYU's exemplary faculty. In most programs, these courses are held on site at NYU's own centrally located academic centers. While most courses are taught in English, students may also select from courses offered in the host country's language. A majority of the programs have strong ties to the world's best urban universities, where students can enroll in multiple courses. Learning outside the classroom is encouraged by interaction with the host culture through internships, community service, excursions, and cultural activities.

The World's Greatest Cities

All NYU academic sites abroad boast newly renovated structures usually located within the city center, with the exception of our program in Berlin, which is housed in Humboldt University. In addition to computing facilities, sites are equipped with all the amenities necessary for students to keep up with their studies, from listening and viewing stations to rehearsal spaces, art studios, and darkrooms. Housing is guaranteed at all sites abroad and is available in apartments, residence halls, and homestays, often in the most popular areas of each city.

Student Experience

NYU study abroad programs are dedicated to the well-being of students inside and outside the classroom. In addition to a highly qualified academic support staff and noted faculty, a full-time student-life staff manages the safety and welfare of students at all of our sites abroad. A knowledgeable staff is quick to respond to all kinds of emergencies that may arise at any time of day and can direct students to local resources. In addition, the staff plans social events, trips, and activities for students to do in their free time.

Immersion Opportunities

At NYU sites abroad, students find strong ties to the local community that provide numerous immersion opportunities in the host culture throughout the semester. Internship and volunteer opportunities are a large part of many of our programs, allowing students to learn the language and culture while gaining hands-on experience in various capacities. Other immersion opportunities include lectures, extracurricular activities with local students, and trips to surrounding cities and landmarks.

Scholarships and Financial Aid

NYU awards scholarships to a number of students from outside institutions studying abroad in NYU programs. Participants are also encouraged to contact their home institution regarding portable financial assistance such as Pell Grants, Stafford Loans, and educational PLUS loans. Through a consortium agreement initiated by the student's home university, this assistance may travel with the student to be applied to NYU study abroad. Visiting students may also be able to make installment payments through a Deferred Tuition Plan. Please see our Web site for further information.

NYU students receive the same financial assistance package studying abroad as at the Washington Square campus. Students are encouraged to contact the Office of Financial Aid for an adjustment to their financial aid package if they anticipate increased expenses while abroad.

Admission

The admissions process ensures that all students studying abroad with NYU are capable of performing to the same high academic standards held abroad as in New York City. In addition to matriculating NYU students, NYU's international sites draw an exceptional group of students from the country's leading institutions each semester.

All students complete an online application that includes a personal statement. Non-NYU students submit additional material to support their online application, including an official college transcript and a letter of recommendation.
