Green Apple Move Out Press Release

Starting this Friday, May 2, NYU's Green Apple Move Out collection project will give students at ten NYU residence halls the opportunity to find a second life for numerous items that might otherwise be discarded during the annual May move out.

Items ranging from linens to clothing to electronics will be collected in designated locations and donated to non-profit organizations, benefiting the local community and the global environment.

"Everyone at NYU is excited about the Move Out, as it is a win-win-win: Local charities get usable items, NYU reduces its waste, and participating students are given the opportunity to do the right thing," says Jennie Tichenor, the Move Out's coordinator.

The project is expected to collect at least 25,000 pounds of re-usable material and is fully funded by NYU's Sustainability Task Force Green Grants and generous support by NYU Recycling, ARAMARK, and Gallatin alumnus Jordan Anger.

The ten dorms participating are Brittany, Goddard, Hayden, Palladium, Rubin, Third North, University Hall, Weinstein, Mercer and D'Agostino Halls.
