

Have an idea for a way to make NYU a more sustainable place?

Apply for a *Green Grant* to make it happen!

Each year, the Sustainability Task Force competitively awards Green Grants ranging from \$0-\$20,000 to students, faculty and staff for **innovative sustainable project proposals** yet to be explored at the institutional level. Last year, 23 diverse projects received more than \$150,000 of support!



How do I apply for a Green Grant?

Submit an **Expression of Interest** at www.nyu.edu/sustainability/ggeoi. Only EOIs submitted before June 15 will be guaranteed feedback, but remain very useful!

Next, draft a more detailed **Project Proposal** by **July 27**.

Application Timeline:

June: Feedback on EOIs sent to applicants on a rolling basis

July 27: Project proposals due (initial round)

August: Finalists notified and given feedback on initial proposals

August 31: Project proposals due (final round)

September: Third annual Green Grant Projects announced

What kinds of projects receive Green Grants?

Previous projects have included **operational improvements** to increase environmental efficiency, innovative **sustainability research**, creative **outreach projects**, and the **development of community resources**.

In awarding Green Grants, the Sustainability Task Force considers **environmental and educational impact, feasibility, scalability, and innovation**.

Who can apply?

All **NYU students, faculty, and employees** affiliated with NYU in the 2009-2010 school year are eligible to lead Green Grants, and are encouraged to **collaborate** with alumni, neighbors, and others.
