

NYU PRAGUE INTERNSHIP PROGRAMS

The following chart outlines the differences between the non-credit NYU Prague Non-Credit Internship program and the NYU Prague for-credit Academic Internship Program.

	Non-Credit Internship Program	Academic Internship Program
How many hours/week must student intern?	3-20 hours per week on average, but there is no specific requirement. It depends on the mutual agreement between the student and the organization.	16 hours per week
How long does the internship run?	11-13 weeks on average, but there is no specific requirement	11 weeks
Is academic credit awarded for participating in the program?	No	Yes, 4 credits for participation in the program
Are there any mandatory requirements for students during the semester (other than the internship itself)?	No	Yes, students enroll in the Internship Seminar and Fieldwork Course, which meets weekly.
Who manages the internship placement?	Host organizations independently manage their own placement opportunities in collaboration with NYU Prague staff.	EUSA, NYU's internship partner, organizes student placements. NYU staff liaise with EUSA staff and also serve as contacts for students throughout the semester.
In which industries can students intern?	<p>NYU Prague is constantly growing its internship network. Some areas students intern include: Business, Education, Film, Journalism, Music, and Politics.</p> <p>* For a full list of placements, please refer to the NYU Prague non-credit internships webpage.</p>	<p>EUSA conducts a customized internship search based on individual students' academic and professional interests and goals.</p> <p>EUSA places students in a wide range of industries, including, but not limited to: Business, Education, Film, Journalism, Law, Music, Politics, and Theater.</p> <p>* There is no specific EUSA placement list due to the customized nature of the placement process.</p>
What does the application process entail?	<p>Email Jitka Kalasova (jitka@nyu.edu), the NYU Prague Internship Coordinator, a resume and cover letter for the position(s) in which you are interested in applying.</p> <p>NYU Prague hosts an internship meeting at the beginning of each semester for students to meet with and learn about potential host organizations.</p>	Online applications are due the semester prior to arrival. Students will need to submit a personal statement and a resume reviewed by the Wasserman Center.
Is the application process competitive?	Competitiveness varies by placement, as NYU Prague students often compete against local Czech and other non-Czech students.	Competitiveness varies by semester, as there are 20 spots available in the program.
Does being accepted in to the program guarantee a placement?	No. Students are independently competing for placements.	Yes. All students accepted into the program are guaranteed a placement. Students receive an interview-contingent placement offer before the start of classes. If a match is not confirmed after the interview, EUSA will identify a new internship opportunity for the student.
