I write to announce the launch of an online initiative, the [Faculty in the Global Network](#) website, which will serve as a consolidated information hub for NYU faculty. Gathering resources from offices and programs around the University, the website gives faculty a unified place for information about teaching, conducting research, and participating in academic planning for NYU’s portal campuses in Abu Dhabi and Shanghai and its 11 global sites. The website highlights opportunities for faculty, and encourages collaboration between faculty colleagues in all of NYU’s locations. Unlike other websites about NYU’s global network that are primarily geared towards students, this site is uniquely a resource for faculty. The website is easily accessed by clicking on the Faculty channel in the violet ribbon at the top of any NYU page and following the link to [Faculty in the Global Network](#).

The immediate impetus for developing this website was the excellent priority recommendation of the [June 2014 report of the Faculty Advisory Committee on the University’s Global Network](#). I thank the leadership of this committee and also the Global Network University Committee of the Tenured/Tenure Track Faculty Senators Council for their input on this new website.

Our goal in the Office of the Provost has been to announce this resource at the start of the academic year, and we do so, knowing that the site will continue to develop and expand.
