



FACT SHEET NYU INDICES OF INTEREST

Faculty Salaries

According to the most recent AAUP salary survey (Fall 2011), the average salaries for NYU tenured and tenure-track faculty were within the top 2% of faculty across the country. NYU's rankings improved in all categories over the prior year to #6, #24 and #10, for full, associate, and assistant professors, respectively, out of the 1,251 institutions surveyed. The AAUP data exclude schools of medicine.

In addition to the numbers reported above:

- The number of full-time Abu Dhabi standing faculty is projected to grow to approximately 182 by 2016.
- For NYU Shanghai, based on a targeted faculty-undergraduate student ratio of 9:1, the number of full-time faculty is projected to grow to approximately 100 by fiscal 2018. (If joint appointments are included, the number will grow to 120 by then.)
- The Center for Urban Science and Progress will have 14 new tenured and tenure-track positions by fiscal 2016, increasing to 30 by fiscal 2020.

University-Wide Budget Trends FY 2009-2013

- Net tuition and fees reduced from 59% to 54% of total revenue
- Salaries and fringe benefits increased from 50% to 52% of total expenses
- Spending on the schools rose from 60% to 67% of total expenses
- Spending on administrative operations fell from 10% to 7% of total expenses

Bond Ratings

The University enjoys “double A” ratings from the two major agencies: Aa3 from Moody’s and AA- from S&P.

- In a report dated March 12, 2012, Moody’s reported “New York University’s market position as one of the nation’s largest private higher education institutions with a strengthening global presence provides the fundamental underpinning for its Aa3 rating.”
- NYU’s current ratings enable NYU to borrow - bonds, loans and lines of credit - at a lower cost.

Student Debt and Financial Aid

- The “mean” loan debt is the most commonly reported amount of student debt. However, the “median,” also reported here, may actually reflect a more accurate measure, given the wide variations in loans taken out by students.
- As a reference, nationally, average (mean) student debt is \$26,600, and 66% of graduates borrow.

One standard measure for access and affordability is the percentage of students receiving Pell Grants, the federal grant program targeted to the most needy families and students. NYU’s Pell Grant population comprises 20% of the freshman class this year. This is a very high Pell Grant population and one of the highest among elite



private universities. (For example, the freshman Pell Grant population at Yale is 13%; at Johns Hopkins, 12%; at Princeton, 11%; and at Tufts, 10%.)

Global Network University

The operation of the NYU Abu Dhabi campus is fully paid by a combination of tuition and fees and support from the government of Abu Dhabi. The NYU Washington Square (WSQ) budget does not pay any NYU Abu Dhabi expenses (in fact, NYU WSQ receives reimbursement for direct expenses as well as an overhead fee from NYUAD).

The same arrangement has been established for the not-yet-open NYU Shanghai campus.

The Global Campuses (i.e., excluding NYUAD and NYUSH) generate tuition and fees net of financial aid of \$75 million in 2013, which exceeds the direct expenses of \$67 million.

When taking the Global Network University (GNU) in its entirety (the direct costs of all of the campuses plus overhead costs borne by NYU WSQ, offset by all tuition and fee revenue, fundraising, and management fees), the GNU requires no subsidy by NYU WSQ and in fact generates a surplus.

In addition to the annual operating budget impact described above, over the past five years the GNU has generated over \$160 million in fundraising, and over \$165 million in committed research support from external sources. These benefits are expected to continue and grow.

International Students and Study Away

- The number of international students in NYU's freshman class has risen from 2% in 2002 to 16% in 2012.
- According to the Institute of International Education's annual Open Doors statistical survey of study abroad and international students:
 - The number of NYU students who study abroad has risen from 2,061 in 2002-03 to 4,156 in 2009-10. [As defined by Open Doors, these figures include undergraduate, graduate, and professional students (US citizens only) who received academic credit for a study abroad experience of two weeks or longer.]
 - The number of undergraduate students who study abroad as a percentage of the student body has risen from 37.4% in 2002-03 to 50.1% in 2009-10.
