Collection: Tweeds TheaterWorks Fractured Classics Series

Established in 1983 in the East Village, Tweeds TheaterWorks is a live theater, performance and musical events company that has produced "category defying extravaganzas"--as Artistic Director Kevin Maloney puts it--for over 30 years, in myriad New York venues from tiny clubs to Off-Broadway and Broadway stages. Tweeds has produced shows with downtown newcomers and established theater performers, artists and singers such as Lypsinka, John Kelly and Carol Lipnik.

In 1985 Tweeds began collaborating on fundraisers with the organization God's Love We Deliver --"the New York City metropolitan area's leading provider of nutritious, individually-tailored meals to people who are too sick to shop or cook for themselves."-- creating live readings and staged performances that "fracture" classic films disguised with titles like *The Bad Seedling*, *Imitation of Imitation of Life*, or *Jungle Red* (aka *The Women*), using drag performers and other unusual casting. While irreverent and comical the adapted screenplays are performed as close as possible to the original author's (original) intent (though there may be interpolated music at times!) However, these methods have proven challenging due to copyright assertions and cease and desist orders from writers like Edward Albee, hence the "one-night only" strategy of the events.

Initially a hit with in-the-know Gay New Yorkers, the scope of the productions soon expanded with general theater patrons waiting for the next secret date of the (barely) pseudonym'd "classic" title to be announced. Over the years, celebrities who have that have participated in the series include Joan Rivers, Jackie Hoffman, Lily Tomlin and Isabella Rossellini.

Maloney describes the "Fractured Classics" series as "the USO Shows of the AIDs crisis" (i.e. like the WWII live entertainment for overseas troops and families) bringing laughter and meals to the Gay community (who were most closely associated with the disease in the early 1980s). The materials would be a hugely valuable (and entertaining) for theater scholars and lovers, social historians of downtown New York and of the LGBT and drag communities as well as cineastes.

The TFC collection's audiovisual items include video documentation of the live performances, taped video sequences created as humorous cinematic extensions of the plays (for instance the flashback in *Suddenly Last Summer*) as well as the source movies that have been fractured! Additionally, the audiovisual collection may have DVDs of the source films and files of trailers and the trailers made for the Tweeds productions.

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Metadata Application Profile
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I am using Cen en 15907 as my meta data standard to create the application profile for my database because the term “Cinematographic work” as defined by the standard usefully encompasses the “intellectual/artistic” content of a work along with the method by which it was made in an audiovisual media (manifestation) and the items or carriers on which the work resides. This allows the standard to describe live events and related versions of the same work in other media. Appropriately, my collection’s main entities are the live theater performances of the TweedsTheaterWorks Company that are based on classic film dvd’s and screenplays.
